## REGISTRATION INFORMATION

**Families enrolled in PACCC will be given priority registration at their individual centers from March 6 - 10. Open registration will begin on March 13 at the PACCC office.**

- Child care will not be provided on Tuesday, July 4, 2006.
- Payments for the first three summer sessions and after-school care are due no later than May 31, 2006. Payments for sessions 4, 5, 6 & 7 are due on or before June 30, 2006. Payment for session 8 and the last week of summer are due on or before July 31, 2006.
- A deposit is required at the time of registration to reserve your child's/children's enrollment. A deposit of \$500 will be required for the following summer programs: Nothing But Fun, Neighborhood Adventure Fun, Girls Just Wanna Have Fun, and both After-School Programs. A deposit of \$520 will be required for full day care in the K-1 Fun Program and \$420 for part day care. *This deposit will be applied toward your child's final two weeks of attendance.*
- Payment of full fee or a two-week deposit (a maximum of \$520) is required in advance.
- Termination of a contract for a PACCC summer program will require a written notice and must be received in the administrative office two weeks prior to the date of termination. A processing fee will be charged as follows: \$50 on or before May 19, 2006, and on May 20, 2006, the fee increases to \$100.
- *No refund will be given for cancellations requested after 5:00 p.m. on June 16, 2006.*
- Refunds will not be issued for no-shows.
- Substituting one session or program for another is allowed on a space-available basis. Requests for changes must be in writing and received in the PACCC administrative office two weeks in advance and accompanied by a processing fee as follows: \$25 per change, on or before May 19, 2006, and on May 20, 2006 the fee increases to \$50
